

## Will GBC require masks?

No. The CDC suggests that fully vaccinated people need not wear masks, and Governor Northam has eliminated the mask mandate. However, we welcome the wearing of masks for those who feel more comfortable wearing them. In addition, following CDC guidance, we encourage everyone who is not fully vaccinated to wear a mask.

#### Will GBC require social distancing?

No. Governor Northam is removing all capacity and gathering restrictions on May 28. However, we do encourage those who are not fully vaccinated to distance themselves from others, following CDC guidance.

## Will we sing?

Yes. We will worship through song in our sanctuary worship.

#### What if I'm not yet comfortable in an environment that includes singing and sitting close to others?

In our Multipurpose Room, we will offer a live-stream of our sanctuary worship for those in our church family who feel safer in a setting without singing and with more space to spread out. In addition, we will continue to live stream our services on You Tube, so you may worship with us from home.

#### Will there be childcare?

We will offer a nursery for children ages 4 and under. Our nursery workers will be fully vaccinated. Children will not be required to wear masks, though they are certainly free to if they choose.
