Our mission trip week for our students was absolutely incredible. Over the week of July 12-17th, three of our students had the opportunity to volunteer with local organizations doing wonderful work within the greater Richmond area.

We partnered with the James River Park System, helping to clean up trash and debris along the canal walk in downtown Richmond. We helped a food pantry in Henrico County called Lamb's Basket who are providing meals for families who are in need within Henrico County. We packed bags of food for the families, helped organize and stock their shelves, and helped them clean the floors within their warehouse facility. Our last day, we had the opportunity to partner with an organization on the southside of Richmond known as Soles4Souls. This is an organization who provides shoes and clothing for communities in need and even partners with local businesses in underserved communities to help lift them out of poverty.

While we were there, we helped to sort three huge boxes of shoes that were being sent out to various places the following week. On our shorter work days, we had the opportunity to visit several museums in Richmond. We visited the Virginia Museum of Fine Arts with the intention of seeing the stories that the various artists were telling through their work. We thought about the ways that these artists' stories represented the broader story of God and how we ourselves find a similar theme in our own lives as we seek to follow Jesus. We also had the chance to visit the Valentine Museum in Richmond. Through this visit, we talked about the ways that God has worked through history in our own communities where we live and serve.

Overall, it was an amazing week filled with fellowship and meaningful conversations. I am in awe of the way the Spirit was moving that week and I'm grateful to be a part of this journey with our students as they grow deeper in their faith.




