Nobody at Cracker Barrel was prepared for the backlash they'd when thev suddenly revamped the restaurant's original logo last week. In fact, public furor at the change rose to such levels that the company's restaurant value dropped by \$100 million in just a few days. Why were people so upset? For many, they felt as if Cracker Barrel was abandoning its identity: they removed the iconic picture of Uncle Herschel lounging by the barrel in the old logo and replaced it with no pictures, just the words Cracker Barrel in generic lettering. To many Cracker Barrel enthusiasts, the restaurant was trying to disassociate itself from who they really were in an effort to try to please everyone.

It made me wonder: does the church ever do that? Do we, as Christ-followers, ever do that? I mean, according to scripture, our truest identity comes as children of God, followers of Jesus who have been transformed by his grace. But I think that sometimes, we make the same mistake that Cracker Barrel made: we forget our roots. We define ourselves by our jobs, our families or our reputations. We forget that our truest identity comes from Christ.

My parents just celebrated their 50th wedding anniversary. We got together as a family and recalled our favorite moments and stories, and it wasn't lost on anyone how blessed we are. But I wanted to say a few words that evening, as is custom at those types of events.

If you've ever tried to write a speech, you know it rarely goes as planned when put into action. And I didn't want to write something and then stumble all over myself trying to sound good. So, I decided I'd just jot down a few memories and try and get a laugh, then tell them I loved them and be done with it. I started making a list of my most poignant memories:
