We're almost here! Whether you've been reading the Bible with us throughout the year or simply following along through Sunday's sermons, you've likely noticed we're nearing the end of the Old Testament. In August, we'll start reading Matthew and the New Testament. If you haven't been reading the Bible through with us, but you'd like to join us as we begin the New Testament, we'd love to have you.

But let's not get ahead of ourselves! The prophets (Isaiah - Malachi) comprise almost 1/3 of the Old Testament, yet they're some of the most neglected books in the Bible. And that's because they're filled with strange names and unfamiliar places. They're not always easy to read. And yet...they may have a word from God that is exactly what we need right now.

The prophets' job was to invite Israel back to the hope God has for them. As so often happens today, Israel and Judah found themselves distracted from God's plan for them. Usually when that happened, they suffered. The prophets' invitation to return to right living with God promised a new beginning and a fresh start. We've had our own fair share of hard times over the past several years, and I'm excited to preach through the prophets

in the month of July with you. Each week, we'll examine how the prophets' words brought hope in the midst of hard times.

Personally, I feel like God has brought our church family a lot of hope lately. I'm thrilled that we called Pastor Sharon to be our Minister of Families. I've enjoyed my listening sessions with different groups in the church and excited by the ways God seems to be leading us. (I'll share what I've heard this fall at a town hall meeting.) And I'm excited by all the ways our church family has stepped up to serve. A big thanks goes out to Kitt Townsend, the children's committee, and the food service committee for such a fun Summer Celebration cookout last month. I'm particularly grateful for the praise team that's been leading us in a song in Sunday morning worship. I'm also excited about the drama ministry that's developing and the folks who have volunteered to help in our A/V booth.

I want to thank everyone for the wonderful welcome I have received. In the coming weeks and months, I will be meeting with various committees, as well as families, getting to know the hopes and dreams that each has for their ministry area and their growth as disciples.

You might ask, what exactly is family ministry? That is a fair question. However, churches often define family ministry in different ways. Some churches approach family ministry as a program for counseling families who are experiencing troubles. Other churches focus the family ministry on developing healthy Christian homes. Yet others understand family ministry as a program to develop family-like relationships in the church. In reality, churches with family ministry programs probably have some mixture of all of the above. As I am meeting with committees and families, I will be gathering information that will help our church define its own understanding of family ministry.

A core component of family ministry is Christian education. We are very blessed to have talented and passionate teachers for our children and youth. But that is only a part of the education process. In her book, Fashion Me a People, Maria Harris writes, "... the church does not have an educational program; it is an educational program." I love this quote. You will hear me refer to it often. Everything that occurs within a church and within a congregation is educational. This obviously includes teaching, but also includes learning through worship, learning through community and fellowship, and learning through service. As I am meeting with committees and families, I will be assessing ways in which the church can synchronize events and ministries to take advantage of all the opportunities for the church to "be" an educational program. This is important for family ministry because such a church is the perfect environment for a family ministry that partners with parents in the discipleship of their children.

My first request of the congregation is to pray for the family ministry here at Goochland; ask for God's guidance as we move forward. This is going to be a challenging but ultimately wonderful journey; I look forward to taking it with you.




