Spring is one of my favorite times of year, because new life is emerging everywhere. The trees begin to open up, flowers start to bud, and birds return from the south. It's like everything that's dead wakes back up.

It's fitting, then, that we observe Easter in the spring. Because Jesus Christ's resurrection from the dead reminds us that we, too, can find new life. The parts of our lives that have been dulled can be reawakened. The parts of our lives that have felt dead can receive new life. That's the promise of Easter. That's the essence of our faith.

New life is a gift from God, but there are some things we can do that will help us receive it. That's the point of Lent. Lent is a season of self-examination, a time for us to do some spring cleaning in our souls. Each Sunday in Lent, I'll be preaching on the eight deadly thoughts that our spiritual forefathers and mothers identified. As we learn to recognize these thoughts in our own lives, we'll be able to unlearn the habits they foster and replace them with habits that help us receive God's new life. In addition, we're giving away free Lenten devotionals that are found in the foyers of both the Sanctuary and New Life Building. We'll be having a special Maundy Thursday Service on Thursday, April 6 in the sanctuary at 7:00 pm that will help us prepare for the new life of the resurrection. I

hope you'll take advantage of these offerings in preparing for Easter.

Our Easter service will be at 9:30 am on Sunday, April 9. Following the service, we'll have an Easter Egg Hunt for the children and photo booths for families and individuals as well. It'll be a festive morning as we celebrate the promise of new life that Christ brings.

They'll be other festive opportunities between now and Easter, too. Many of you have come to Community Table, our new Wednesday night dinner offering to the community. I lead a Bible Study at 4:30 pm on Wednesdays, and we have dinner at 6:00 pm, followed by a short program designed to connect us with each other and with what's going on in our community. 

SHARON'S UPDATES

The season of Lent begins with Ash Wednesday and lasts until Easter. It is a time of preparation for the coming of Easter. Many choose to fast during this period, to give up something- chocolate, coffee, social media time - something of significance that one may have become too reliant on. Too often, the act of fasting is the beginning and the end of our activity of preparation; we do not follow through on the purpose behind the fast - to focus and rely more on God. Through fasting, we are allowing a fresh space in which we can encounter God.

What spiritual practice can occupy this space for you? While this is important at an individual level, I believe that this period of preparation also offers opportunities to build family practices that focus of God. Consider what you can do together as a family that will build your relationship to God. Here is an idea from Christian author, Traci Smith:

Candle Prayer Time* - This prayer practice allows the family to share in prayer time without worrying about finding the "just right" words or feeling the pressure of including everything and everyone for whom they want to pray.

- 1. Parent and child (or the whole family) gather in a dim or dark room and light a candle.
- 2. Say, "This candle burning is our prayer. Just as the light fills up the dark room, we know that our prayers are lifted up to God. Let's sit here for a minute and watch the candle and know that our prayers are known by God, even if we don't know what we want to say or how to say it."
- At the end of a minute or so say, "Now we are going to end our candle prayer. I will blow out the candle and we will all say 'Amen.' We will know that God heard our prayer."

For we died and were buried with Christ by baptism. And just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glorious power of the Father, now we also may live new lives.




